On OHIP for international students he mentioned that he would be willing to co-sign a letter to the government about getting OHIP by the end of the year, on the inquiry he mentioned that we should speak to the secretariat personally and that the office does take such inquiries seriously and we would continue to ensure that the line of communication is open. We will be following up with the office of the president to make sure these things are followed up on.



Skills was a wonderful experience. This was my 3<sup>rd</sup> skills symposium and I wanted to not just learn new things but connect with different people. I was able to learn new skills about campaigning amongst a number of different things. This annual event put on by CFS took place in Scarborough. It gave us a chance to actually get to know the campus as well as get acquainted with our counterparts at UTSU and SCSU.

#### Interviews – Frosh and Job

Zehra, Francesco and myself sat through every single meeting for coordinators and associates with other executives stepping into interviews that affected their portfolios. After long interview sessions, deliberation and consultation with the team we were able to come to a conclusion on what persons to be selected for the different positions. #### **CFS Skills**

This symposium held by the Canadian Federation of Students was a great experience to learn the required skills to successfully run a Students' Union. We were able to bring 15 representatives on this weekend long conference that was held at UTSC. There were different workshops from building an inclusive student movement to how to budget properly. With union from all over Ontario, we were able to share experiences and learn how other folks do things on their campus. We are excited to bring everything we learned back to our campus and enhance the student experience here at UTM.

#### **Dentist or Convenience Store?**

For the past month, we have been in constant consultation with external companies and internally, on bringing a new service to our campus. #### 1) Academic Societies Training/ Handbook Update

The handbook was completed by Mehak Kawatra (Academic Societies Coordinator) and myself. We sectioned off the handbook to be a bit more appealing and added templates and sections on how to create a constitution, a budget, a list of good/bad practices and more. We will be adding an index with contact info of the Staff/Faculty Liaisons, as well as creating a resource binder for our societies to use. In regards to the Academic Societies Training, that is scheduled to take place on Monday, July 13<sup>th</sup>, 2015. We are finalizing the details but the event will kick start with the Dean, Amy Mullin, followed by a UTMSU 101, a Societies 101, a break for lunch then sessions on mental diversity, equity and anti-oppression, and lastly, time and stress management. We invited all the societies, the Academic Societies Advisory Committee, the board members and execs to participate.

#### 2) CFS Skills

In May the executives and some board members traveled to UTSC to participate in CFS Skills. It was a great weekend where we met a lot of new individuals and learned a lot of new skills to apply in order to improve our students union (Eg. How to build a message box, budgeting, anti-oppression, using social media to our advantage, etc.).

#### 3) Board Retreat

This month the executives, board members and executive director went to Blue Mountain for our board retreat where we learned about the governance structure, upcoming campaigns and events and the priorities of the board members. The best part was bonding over volleyball and food. I'm very excited to see how this year unfolds because we have so many passionate individuals on our team.

#### 4) Hiring Associates/Coordinators

This past month we held interviews for all of the associate and coordinator positions. I hired two associates, an Academic Advocacy and a Sustainability coordinator. There were many applicants and some very qualified individuals but after discussing and picking the people I am confident that we (the hiring committee and myself) made the best decision. I have had a meeting with the associates and coordinators to get to know each other a little more as well as to outline our goals and visions for the upcoming year. We're all very excited to execute the things we have planned.

#### 5) CFS National General Meeting

During the first week of June, the executives travelled to Ottawa/Gatineau to participate in the National General Meeting. Here locals from across the country come together to discuss important motions that affect some, if not all of us as students. There was a lot of discussion on important topics like police brutality, Bill C-51, and sexual harassment policies on campus. The best part about these meetings was the fact that there were spaces for marginalized people to speak their minds, for example, the racialized constituency, womyns', queer, and provincial constituencies. This allowed us to centralize the voices of people that really needed to be heard. Moving forward, there will be another meeting in November for us to come back with new ideas and improvements to further enhance our university experiences.

#### 6) Student Rights on the Syllabus/ Academic Integrity Video

We are still in talks with the Deans about the syllabus changes, I am going to follow up with them next week about what changes they would like to see. In regards to the academic integrity video, I am going to have the academic advocacy coordinator write a script so that after the training we can organize the societies so that they're all involved in some way. I want this video to be ready to present to department chairs in mid-August so that there is time to make any edits and so that the video can be played in the first week of September.

#### 7) Vlogs

The vlogs are being received well. I have decided to release only one vlog a month pertaining to important dates and deadlines, however I will continue to make biweekly videos about things going on with the students' union.

#### 8) Ramadan Iftar Dinners

MSA and UTMSU have planned four Ramadan Iftars. 2 will be potlucks, 1 will be a BBQ following the exam destressor UTMSU is providing to accommodate those that can't eat during the day and the last one will be the annual Iftar held in the Blind Duck/Presentation Room. I'm very happy with the turn out of our first dinner, hopefully the numbers will continue to grow as the month progresses.

#### **Federal Elections**




#### **CFS Skills**


