

### UTMSU's 2021 Fall Racialized Community Involvement Grant

Fighting against oppressive frameworks requires an immense amount of hard work and dedication that often goes unnoticed. In recognition of the time and energy put forth by UTM students to foster equity, the UTMSU is launching the Racialized Community Involvement Grant. This grant will be awarded to three applicants who have engaged in anti-racism efforts on and/or off-campus. This grant is meant to reward and empower students who have shown drive and commitment to supporting and contributing to the improvement of racialized communities, on and off campus.

It is essential that you complete all pages of this application and explain in detail any exceptional expenses or circumstances. This grant is based on standards created by the UTMSU.

Please find the detailed requirements for this grant below:

- Applicant must be a UTM student. This includes full-time and part-time undergraduate students
- Folks can apply to the bursary as an individual or group of peers. However, if you choose to submit a joint application, the grant money awarded will be split among your group members.
- Applicant has been actively involved in advocacy that uplifts and supports the racialized community
- Your involvement must unpaid/voluntary
- Applicants cannot apply as a UTM or UTMSU Club
