Preamble:

The Governing Council, established by the University of Toronto Act, 1971, oversees the academic, business and student affairs of the University. It is composed of 50 members - 25 members from within the internal University community, including administrative staff, teaching staff and students, and 25 members external to the University, including alumni and Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council appointees.

At the University of Toronto Mississauga, the Campus Council, Campus Affairs Committee and Academic Affairs Committee act as an extension to Governing Council and allow for local decision making.

The UTM Campus Council, effective July 1, 2013, oversees the academic, business and student affairs of the University of Toronto Mississauga such as the operating budget, tuition fees, and

capital projects. On behalf of the Governing Council, the UTM Campus Council exercises governance oversight of campus specific matters. It is comprised of 28 members – four (4) of which are student representatives, elected through Campus Council elections.

Total membership of the Campus Affairs Committee is 34 members, seven (7) of which are student representatives. In general, the Campus Affairs Committee is concerned with matters that directly concern the quality of student and campus life, such as residence, parking fees, and food costs. The Committee recommends matters for approval to the appropriate body of the Governing Council, through the UTM Council.

The membership of the Academic Affairs Committee consists of 63 members, including eight (8) students. In general, the Academic Affairs Committee is concerned with matters affecting the teaching, learning and research functions of the Campus.

Preamble:

As students number well over 80,000 across the three campuses of the University of Toronto, often times it is left to 8 students to make decisions on behalf of those 80,000 full time, part time undergraduate, graduate and non-degree students.

Those 8 students sit on the highest decision making body at the university, it is called Governing Council. Established by the University of Toronto Act, 1971, it oversees the academic, business and student affairs of

the University. At the University of Toronto Mississauga, The UTM Campus Council, acts as an extension of the Governing Council.

These three (3) bodies are comprised have 5 major stakeholders - staff, faculty, community partners, administration and students. They review motions and make important decisions on behalf of nearly 16,000 full time and part time, undergraduate and graduate students at UTM. Students do have a say on these committees, however their roles are limited as they are typically outnumbered.

I want to give a huge shout out to Ahmed Zaki, our Division 5 member who has been a really great resource and has bridged some of the gap between the UTMSU and its MAM students. I hope to work more with him to better serve our students!

Super '16 was a blur in all honesty, but it was definitely a week I won't forget because of all of the amazing new programming we had. I, along with many others, LOVED the first ever Foam Party that was hosted on Wednesday night because it was a great mix of something new but also gave a nice spin to what is traditionally our pub night. UTMAC games ran smoother than ever before and our carnival was a huge success as we collaborated with many other campus partners so that our students could learn about all the resources available to them on campus. We also supported Residence Life by helping first years move in on the Sunday before Orientation started which was a great way to really get to know our students that live on campus. I'm going to keep it short because I'm sure the VP Campus Life will expand on this.

Our second annual Mature & Part Time Students Orientation was held on August 29th in collaboration with our good friends, the Association of Part Time Undergraduate Students (APUS)! We held a very lovely sit down dinner at the Blind Duck Pub with a fun game of bingo, some giveaways, and an inspiring presentation from our Interim Principal, Ulli Krull. It doesn't end there because in October we will be collaborating with APUS again to host a Part Time & Mature Students Workshop with an aim to create a closer part time and mature student community, to help navigate the system that is UofT, academic planning, financial aid and more!

FREE BREAKFAST WEDNESDAY

Free Breakfast Wednesdays are finally back! During the first week of September, volunteers new and old came together to discuss the budget for this year's Free Breakfast Wednesday's. We have a number of new suggestions like foods, themes, ways to increase our efficiency and better serve our students. For example, we're looking forward to our themed breakfasts after Thanksgiving, Chinese New Year and some Middle Eastern breakfast foods. We're going to look into different sponsors who can help support our breakfasts to allow us to purchase different materials and appliances like new toasters, and eco-friendly take away containers, cups, and cutlery to reduce our carbon footprint! Our first breakfast was a HUGE success with more than 300 students coming to eat some eggs, French toast and turkey bacon! For the first breakfast we also opened up the Meeting Room so that more students could enjoy their meal while sitting instead of awkwardly carrying their books and plates outside the student center. Next week we hope to put on some Netflix for students to eat and unwind!

UTM GOVERNANCE

I've personally spent a lot of time on UTM governance this past month. I was lucky enough to be invited to the UTM Academic Affairs Agenda Planning Committee where I got to present a number of different student priorities like Grade Forgiveness, new academic accommodations, Co-Op, more diverse summer school options and divestment. The committee told me that they would further discuss these priorities but hopefully allow me to present to the AAC on Grade Forgiveness. When they said this I was thrilled because in the past 6 years that the UTMSU has worked on Grade Forgiveness, it has never even been discussed at that level. I'm still waiting to hear back but I've been very persistent in following up. This could be a huge victory in the making for our students. Alongside the AAC, I personally sit on the Campus Affairs Committee. The first meeting this month consisted of the preliminary operating budget for UofT and a presentation on UofT's draft policy on Sexual Assault. With my personal experience with UofT's Governing Council and UTM's Campus Council, I'm learning the ways in which I can use the system and space to further benefit the needs of our students. With that being said, the UTMSU is working with the UTM Graduate Student Association (UTMAGS) to propose new structures for QSS, the sole body that consults with student representatives. The president of UTMAGS and I will be meeting with Mr. Mark Overton to make those suggestions to improve QSS. Last year, the UTMSU boycotted the QSS because a number of reoccurring issues were being left unaddressed. This year we're hoping to go back to the table but under the condition that the spirit of QSS and the recommendations brought forward by student representatives from UTMSU, UTMAGS, UTMAC, and UTM Residence Council are taken seriously. UTM Governance is very important because the vast majority of issues students face like rising tuition costs, food costs, parking and residence costs are approved at these levels. Back when the Erindale College Council existed, students made up a majority of the council, so their concerns and suggestions were taken seriously and were implemented. Unfortunately, now, UTM's Campus Council, Campus Affairs and Academic Affairs Committee have minimal student representation and for that reason students suffer. I look forward to giving a report back next month about the progress UTMSU has made in improving QSS and UTM's Campus Council.

UTMSU FALL BY-ELECTIONS

The preparation for the UTMSU Fall By-Election began over the summer wherein we hired our CRO, DRO, and Poll Clerks, as well as created a plebiscite question to administer. The Chief Returning Officer for this election was an external candidate because a number of students in the past have brought up concerns about the impartialness of an internal CRO. Thus far, we have been very happy with the work of our CRO, Sahab and our DRO, a UTM student named Tooba. The nomination period began on September 12th - I'm very happy to see that many first year students that attended Super '16 were running for the Division 1 seat. There are currently three people running for the Division 3 spot. The campaigning period began on September 19th and will go up until the last day of voting; voting days are scheduled from September 27th - 29th. The plebiscite question which was created by the Elections & Referenda Committee, then passed at an emergency board meeting, revolves around UofT's Governance structure and the UTM Campus Council more specifically.

We are interested to see whether or not our students feel like they can make real change with the current mechanisms that exist. The information will be used to support or dispute future proposals to UTM's Campus Council. We are hosting a teach in on Thursday, September 22nd called Who Runs This Joint, Anyway? where we'll be talking to students about GC, how students can get involved, and what changes students want to see happen. I'll give a report back on the event next month!

UTMSU COMMISSION MEETING #1

This month UTMSU hosted its first Commission Meeting of the year and it was a HUGE success! I've had my own criticisms of past UTMSU Commission Meetings but this one was different because there were some really great conversations about what students want to see leading up to the National Day of Action. We started off with a quick round of introductions, then went straight into explaining what commissioners were. Many of the attendees were first year students who were very eager to get involved. We then struck the ministry meetings and did rotations allowing all of the students to find out more about each and every ministry. Students were able to sign up for the ministries they were most interested in to stay in the loop of when they'd be hosted. Our ministry meetings are beginning this week and I'm very excited to see what comes of them. After the rotations, we changed gears to talk specifically about the Fight the Fees campaign. Students came up with so many ideas to plug in others like a photo campaign where students can share their experiences and struggles in paying tuition, a carnival day where we play games and theme them around winning free tuition, and so much more. We spent a fair amount of time talking about that so we referred the rest of the content to the Ministry of Education & Outreach. Lastly, we invited everyone to get more information and run in the UTMSU Fall By-Election which I touched on above. Since the Commission Meeting I have seen a number of attendees outreach for Academic Advocacy Week, get involved in the election and more! I'm so excited for next month's commission meeting!

EXECUTIVE REPORT INTERNAL AND SERVICES

Despite describing every single month up until now as “hectic and busy,” this past cycle has demonstrated something like none other! This past while has held a number of exciting events and new services such as orientation, Welcome Week, the Ontario General Meeting and our Greenshift order. In addition to this we have been going through hirings and the implementation of a UTMSU WeChat platform.



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GREENSHIFT ORDER

One of our main campaign points during elections and also a core value of our team, is dedication to sustainability and green initiatives this year. With clubs being the backbone of our union, we decided to implement a form that allows clubs and societies to apply for environmental friendly and bio degradable eating utensils such as plates, forks, and other products. The first order arrived earlier last week, and the applications and allocations will be discussed and delivered at the Green Grants committee.

UFEST/ORIENTATION

Orientation went rather smoothly, especially on the logistical side, which was a great success on its own. There were some issues that arose during the week long event, that included breaking of policy for both leaders and orientationees, which led to other consequences. Fortunately, they were all dealt with accordingly, and did not lead to larger harm to the general group.

There were some minor budgeting errors and unforeseen costs, which could lead to a small potential deficit, however, conciliation is currently underway and we won't be able to decide with certainty until later.

U-FEST also turned out to be a great success in the sense that all recognized clubs and campus partners got to table in an organized structure with large success and a huge traffic of students. Some clubs that were not yet recognized decided to table, so we had to politely ask them to leave, for fairness of other recognized clubs. We asked board members, and decided to have an emergency clubs committee meeting during the middle of U-FEST, and managed to recognize around another 8-10 clubs so they could table for the remaining two days. All throughout the week the strong heat waves demoted students from standing outside, however the general event was also extremely successful.

ONTARIO GENERAL MEETING

For the OGM, a total of 8 individuals from local 109 attended the conference, and discussed many motions regarding social justice, GTA wide UPASS, and student union autonomy. There were also a lot of discussions regarding the "Fight the Fees" campaign, and now there's a much larger emphasis on international and marginalized students after much motivation. All in all, it was a great boost of morale to see other member locals fighting for similar issues and supporting all of the work that the CFS does in general.

HIRINGS

In the short past, we interviewed and hired Blind Duck staff, poll clerks, U-pass clerks, a CCR coordinator, and are currently discussing a services manager position. All processes were followed accordingly, and training and quality of work seem to be on point.

WECHAT PLATFORM

As of now, there's been a team of dedicated students including our board members and volunteers working on a UTMSU Wechat account. Wechat is the app that specifically targets Chinese and Mandarin speaking students, and has already received some success in doing so. We believe that this will greatly increase and help advertise our services, events, and campaigns, to the Chinese students who now more focused on as also parts of the membership.

At these spaces we discussed how each of the motions brought forward by different locals would affect the different constituencies or committees we were in. It was a great opportunity to meet with members of different locals and see what they are doing at their students union.



DEANS OFFICE

I have been having with the deans office all summer about the structure of their office and how Dean Amrita Daniere is looking to change the structure of their office. I am the student representative on the Vice Dean search committee with other staff, administration and faculty members. EQUITY

These last few weeks before Orientation have been extremely hectic and time consuming. I've had the chance to meet with my equity team and plan out the year. Working on bursaries and helping hand them out. I'm also trying to work on Queer Orientation and Parallel programming for Orientation currently, which is extremely fun.



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STAFF HIRINGS

We are in the midst of ending our hirings for this year. We have had the privilege of interviewing many candidates for the many different positions we have available for students on campus. Well paying and accessible student jobs are extremely important, especially have employment opportunities on campus. This helps generate a sense of community for those who might not want to get involved or have the time to. It is crucial we continue to advocate for positions on our campus that pay above provincially set minimum wage. Our students are domestic and international, paying exorbitant fees and should be treated fairly.

During hirings I noticed a consistent trend when I would post questions regarding equity, there would be better education regarding equity in our institutions. Students are graduating with the basic understanding of equality and not being able to understand or explain definitions beyond that.

EQUITY SERVICE CENTRE

I have been working on the equity service centre project for this month, along with the president's portfolio. We are currently in the planning phase of this project, this project will help combine and localize all offices and resources for marginalized and minority groups. We are planning on moving the Food Centre office from the Davis building back into the Student Centre, have a Racialized & Indigenous office, a Women & Trans office, Queer office, and the Food Centre office. These spaces would be in the same hallway, we'll be able to help students access all the needs possible. Most importantly these spaces will help students connect with resources off campus as well, which is extremely crucial for students graduating and wanting to continue the work or be able to access resources pertaining to their needs.

We've invited all the important stakeholders to all our meetings, to let them know how important our relationship with them is, and to work together on this project. We have OUT@UTM and our LGBTQ Coordinator working on the Queer space, the Racialized & Indigenous space being researched and worked on by our Racialized coordinator, the Women & Trans space is still in progress.

This is a really exciting project that I am truly humbled to work on. Being able to localize all these important offices and services for students will enable us to better help those in need.

FOOD CENTRE: GOOD FOOD BOX

Along with the Food Centre coordinators I'm working on implementing the idea of the Good Food Box on campus, which will be available through the Food Centre. This box will consist of either locally grown and organic vegetables or fruits, they will cost from \$13-\$34 depending on the size of your family. Individuals with food insecurities will be able to get these boxes for free through the food centre, however if individuals would like to purchase one we will also be providing this option. This will give us a chance to grow the food centre and provide better services through it. This is amazing project that is already present at the St. George campus as well as Ryerson. I've researched both their models and contacted all the relevant individuals.

PARALLEL PROGRAMMING FOR ORIENTATION

Along with the Orientation Coordinator, I'm working on alternative programming to the weeks events. There are many events that might be uncomfortable or inaccessible for all students, therefore we're in the midst of planning events to accommodate for all students.
