RE: Content Warning: mention of death, gun violence

The University of Toronto Mississauga Students' Union (UTMSU) is deeply saddened to hear of the passing of Michael Oppong Berchie, on Monday, February 8th, 2021.

Michael graduated with a Bachelor of Commerce from the University of Toronto Mississauga (UTM) in the spring of 2020, and, according to his father, was thinking of continuing his studies.

Four days ago, Michael was a victim of gun violence. He was fatally shot in Toronto near the intersection of Sage Avenue and Lawrence Avenue West. Gun violence in the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) is an on-going issue that directly impacts marginalized communities at a disproportionately higher rate. Gun violence is avoidable, and this should not have happened.

Michael was a kind, intelligent, and caring individual. We along with the community will continue to feel the impact of this tragic loss. Our hearts are with Micheal's family and loved ones. On behalf of the UTM Students' Union (UTMSU), Commerce and Management Associations, we would like to send our deepest and sincerest condolences to Michael's family, friends, and colleagues.

During this difficult time, Michael's family has asked for the community to raise awareness about the detrimental realities of gun violence in our communities. We encourage community members to continue to further support Michael's family, friends, and colleagues through these trying times. A GoFundMe page was created to support his family with the funeral and other expenses. In Michael's memory, the UTMSU will be making a donation of \$500 and is encouraging other members of the UTM community to support in any way possible.
