Summary of the Recommended Changes to be Presented during the AGM

- Updated division numbers
- Changed "Speaker" to "Chair"
- Added "or designate the chair"
 - If the chair is absent, the chair can designate another person to be the chair for a given meeting
- Removing Green Grants Committee
 - Clubs Committee also approves of grants, so we're putting the role of the Green Grants Committee to the Clubs Committee
- Added ASAC
- Removed UTSU
- Removed club language
 - Ex. Club Week → Welcome Back Week
 - Ex. Club resource → resource session for campus groups
 - Campus groups include clubs, academic societies and levy groups
- Removed "subsequent to September 1 of any year" under Abandonment of Office (pg 26)
 - Rational: a lot of people may not be able to make it to meetings during the summer
- Added the distinction between Closed Committee & Open Committees
 - Closed Committees only board members can sit on it
 - · Open Committees general students can sit on it
- Removed "on the UTM campus" under Committee Procedures (pg 30)
 - No longer have to meet on the UTM campus we're more in a hybrid situation now
 - It's more accessible

#7. UTMSU & BLIND DUCK PUB AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS 2021-2022

Summary

- Blind Duck
 - Statement of Financial Position
 - "Prepaid expenses" (\$44) shown in 2021 & 2022 are actually from 2008 planning to eliminate it next year
 - "Property and Equipment" bought some new furniture for patio to provide dining services
 - "Deferred revenue" shows the cost for buying the new furniture
 - Statement of Operations
 - "Wages and benefits" in 2021 is much lower than in 2022 because the government subsidised some of the wages since it was during the pandemic
- UTMSU
 - Statement of Financial Position

- "cash equivalent" is just cash
- "Short-term investment" is depositing money into the bank to earn interest (not for some project)
- "Inventory" is for the Duck Stop
 - In 2021, all inventory has expired
- "Prepaid expenses" is for insurance
- o Statement of Changes in Net Assets
 - Internally restricted vs unrestricted funds/assets
 - Restricted: fund must be used for what the fund was intended for
 - Ex. Health & Dental fund can only be used for Health & Dental
 - Unrestricted: fund can be used in other projects or whatnot other than in the originally intended area the fund was for
- o Schedule A Finance
 - 2021 generally has lower expenses than 2022 because 2021 was still during the pandemic
 - "Telephone" increased ~\$1000 because it was merged with the "Telephone" from Schedule B - Student Centre
- Schedule C Social Activities and Planning
 - All the revenue comes mainly from selling tickets
 - Orientation revenue comes from selling orientation tickets; others revenue comes from selling tickets during other events
- Schedule F Duck Stop
 - All numbers have increased because 2021 was during the pandemic
- Statement of Operations
 - Summarises all the above schedules

#8. AUDITOR RECOMMENDATION FOR 2022 FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
